Integration of Second-Generation Portuguese and their Perception of Multiculturalism

- **Esra Ari** – Ryerson Center for Immigration & Settlement & King's College, Western University

The marginalization of second-generation Portuguese in the educational institutions and labour market signals their limited integration. Against this backdrop, this study examines the meaning second-generation Portuguese attribute to Canadian multiculturalism. It argues that their interpretation of official multiculturalism softens the contradictions between the promises of official multiculturalism and their marginalized position.

Postcolonial interactions in Luxembourg: Lusophone Solidarities and Struggles

- **Bernardino Tavares** – University of Luxembourg
- **Aleida Vieira** – University of Luxembourg

This paper investigates how past colonial connections and asymmetric histories affect Lusophone migrants' social and work interactions in Luxembourg. It draws on observations and narrative interviews focussing on their solidarities and struggles, to foster a critical understanding of their interactions beyond Portuguese-speaking (Lusophone) states.

Dodging the “R” Word: Portuguese-Canadian Youth’s Perceptions of Racism in their Lives

- **Fernando Nunes** – Mount Saint Vincent University

This presentation will utilize the results of focus group and interview research with Portuguese-Canadian youth, to illustrate how the latter failed to label as “racism” the discriminatory attitudes and practices that they suffer. It will also discuss the implications of this omission for research and policy affecting these youth.

Portuguese Immigrant Women Who Work as Cleaning Ladies, or Domestic Workers, in Canada: Working Relationships Beyond Boundaries

- **Márcia dos Santos** – Mount Saint Vincent University

This study seeks to expand our understanding of why some Portuguese immigrant women enter domestic work instead of other types of jobs, in Canada. It will discuss the reasons that made them enter this type of work and why they choose to stay in this occupation, when the previous reasons might no longer exist.

Recognizing the Lived Experience Through Tutoring and Mentoring Portuguese-Canadians and Latin-Canadians Students: Promoting Pedagogical and Personal Success Utilizing a Community-Based Approach

- **Robert Kenedy** – York University

This panel presentation utilizes Brofenbrenner’s ecological theory and Turner’s notion of lived experience to analyze focus group and interview data with 26 On Your Mark mentees. The analysis of the data suggests that tutoring and mentoring builds community, promotes student success, and that they significantly benefitted from being tutored, especially students who struggled and were at-risk.

This panel comprises part of the *International Symposium 2021* series: *Migration and Integration in the Lusophone World: Historical, Current and Future Perspectives*, that has been organized by the [Lusophone Studies Association](#) and the [Portuguese Studies Review](#). As a part of this series, one panel each month, from August 2021 to February 2022, will be held, featuring international experts on the history, current or future state of migratory movements to, from and within Lusophone nations. Topics will deal with economic, educational, cultural, linguistic, religious, colonial, postcolonial, pre- and post-migratory realities, both within Lusophone nations, as well as in locations that are receiving Lusophone migrants.
